"HELLO ATLANTIQUE, CAN YOU HEAR ME?"

This is the call I heard while traveling across the Great South Bay this past weekend. Almost everybody has a VHF radio on their boat but not everyone knows how to use them properly. I have just completed the Marine Communications Systems class taught by Bob Fisher and I want to share a little piece of what I learned with you. Let's talk about the basic operating procedures for making VHF radio calls.

Here is a summary of channels used by recreational boaters:

CH 16 – used for hailing (calling) and distress

CH 09 – alternate hailing channel when a Mayday call is on Ch 16.

CH 13 – Bridge to bridge, intership, ship to bridge.

CH 70 – Digital Selective Calling (DSC) only, no voice.

CH 68, 69, 71, 72 and 78 – Working channels (72 is for intership only, not for ship to shore)

If you have a VHF radio, you are REQUIRED to monitor CH 16 while underway, unless you have a VHF-FM DSC radio which automatically will monitor CH 70 for DSC distress calls. It is ILLEGAL to monitor a working channel while underway unless your radio has a scanner feature, can monitor two stations at once (one must be CH 16). or you have a DSC radio.

Every radio call should be a brief, concise, clear, effective communication, using a minimum time on the air.

The calling procedure:

- 1. Listen in on a calling station, before speaking, to ensure you are not interrupting another call.
- 2. Repeat the vessel or location called up to three times, followed by your station name (vessel name and FCC call letters if you have them) and channel number, once.
 - a. (BH) "Atlantique, Atlantique, Atlantique this is Beach House, channel one six. Over"
- 3. The call is limited to 30 seconds, including repeating if necessary. If it is not answered you must wait 2 minutes before calling again. Numbers are pronounced individually, "one six" not "sixteen".

Answering procedures:

- 1. Acknowledge the call and request or direct a working frequency.
 - a. (AT) "Beach House, this is Atlantique, switch to CH six niner. Over."
 - b. (BH)" Switching to six niner."

Conducting Vessel Business:

- 2. Vessel station names need not be repeated for each transmission once communications are established on a working channel. Use procedure words to be heard and understood clearly. Once on working channel 69.
 - a. (AT) "Beach House, this is Atlantique. Over"
 - b. (BH) "This is Beach House. We are arriving for our reservation. Over"
 - c. (AT) "Roger, please dock in slip Alpha niner. Atlantique is switching back to channel one six. Out."
 - d. (BH) "Wilco, we will dock in Alpha niner, switching back to one six. Out"

Proceedure Words	Meaning
Affirmative	Yes / Correct
Negative	No / Incorrect
Roger	I have received your last transmission satisfactorily
Wilco	I have received and understand your message, and will comply
Say Again	Repeat your previous transmission
This is	Call sign to follow
I Spell	I shall spell the next word(s) phonetically
Numbers	Numbers to follow
Wait	I must pass for a few seconds
	I have finished my transmission and a response is expected.
Over	Proceed with your transmission.
Out	I have finished my transmission and do not expect a reply.

"HELLO, RADIO CHECK, RADIO CHECK, HELLO" We all hear this daily, mostly on CH 16 also.

It is rare that correct testing procedures are heard on the air. It is possible that failure to abide by the rules may be unintentional and the result of ignorance. The number of requests for radio checks is excessive, and to a large extent unnecessary. The result is interference with legitimate traffic.

Procedure for a proper radio check:

- 1. You must not interfere with a transmission already in progress.
- 2. Radio checks to "any station" are prohibited on CH 16 and on working channels. Radio checks <u>must always</u> be made to a specific vessel or station.
- 3. Find and monitor an ongoing conversation on a working channel.
- 4. Upon the conversation being terminated (you will know as they end it with "Out"), immediately call either of the stations and request a radio test.
 - a. "Uncorked, this is Beach House on Channel seven two. Request radio test, Over."
 - b. "Beach House this is Uncorked, you are Loud and Clear in Massapequa. Out"
- 5. You can also call another station you know is on the air, such as a marina or a towing service. You can make the call on 16 then must move to a working channel for the test.




